

Writing Prompts: Mystery/Thriller Genre



Crime Fiction Prompts

- A body is discovered in a locked room with no doors or windows.
- A thief breaks into a house but finds another criminal already there... dead.
- The perfect heist goes wrong when the team realizes someone on the inside is playing both sides.
- A retired hitman is forced to come out of hiding after their alias is leaked online.
- A lawyer realizes their newest client is guilty—of the crime the lawyer committed years ago.
- An investigative journalist stumbles on a serial killer's diary hidden in an old case file.
- Every time the detective gets close to the truth, a new suspect confesses.
- A police officer discovers their own fingerprints at a fresh crime scene.
- A small town is shaken when everyone receives an anonymous letter claiming one is a killer.
- A cold case detective starts to believe their long-dead suspect may still be alive.

Psychological Thriller Prompts

- A woman wakes up every day with no memory of the previous day—but someone is using this to manipulate her.
- A therapist starts to suspect that one of their patients is a murderer—and they might be next.
- A man's new wife is perfect... too perfect. When she disappears, he's the prime suspect, but did she ever exist?
- A person receives photos of themselves sleeping in their own locked apartment.
- A child's imaginary friend knows too much about real-life murders.
- A woman moves into a new house and finds a diary detailing her own future crimes.
- A man accused of murder insists he's innocent—but video footage shows him committing the crime.
- A psychologist must solve a crime using clues hidden in a patient's recurring dreams.
- After a near-death experience, a man begins hearing the thoughts of everyone around him—and one person is planning a murder.
- A detective becomes obsessed with a killer who leaves no bodies—only missing people who were never reported missing.

Detective & Procedural Prompts

- A new detective must solve their first murder—except their partner is the lead suspect.
- A famous serial killer is caught and imprisoned, but copycat murders start happening with details only the real killer would know.

Writing Prompts: Mystery/Thriller Genre



- An ex-FBI profiler is called back in when their original case becomes active again... 20 years later.
- A detective finds that all of the evidence in their newest case leads back to their own family.
- A rookie cop discovers a secret database of unsolved crimes deliberately hidden by the department.
- A detective wakes up in a crime scene with no memory—and the murder weapon in their hand.
- A long-dead victim leaves behind a cryptic puzzle leading to their real killer.
- A detective investigating a cult starts losing time and memories of the investigation.
- A private investigator is hired to find a missing woman—who's standing in his office two days later claiming he is missing.
- A series of crimes mimic scenes from a detective's first novel.

Twist-Driven & High-Stakes Prompts

- The victim turns out to be the killer, and their own murder is part of their revenge plan.
- A politician is assassinated in front of thousands, but the bullet never came from the crowd.
- A detective solving a string of murders realizes the killer is following their old case reports.
- A cult believes they must murder one person a year to prevent an apocalypse—and they've never been wrong.
- A person's family disappears without a trace. Then they start receiving home videos of them... from the future.
- A train is stopped in the middle of nowhere after a body is found on board. The passengers must solve the crime to move forward.
- Everyone in the building was knocked out for three hours—and no one remembers a thing.
- A detective receives an anonymous package containing a bloodstained letter... written by themselves.
- A killer leaves behind a clue in the form of a children's nursery rhyme.
- The protagonist discovers their own fingerprints on a crime scene they've never visited.

Simple or Short-Form Prompts

- A stranger confesses a crime to the wrong person.
- Someone keeps breaking into the protagonist's apartment but never steals anything.
- A series of murders follow the zodiac signs.
- A child's drawing matches an unsolved crime scene perfectly.
